From the Rabbi's Study

From Worshipping the God of Purim to *Becoming* the God of Purim



One of the most common themes of Purim teaching is the fact that God is noticeably absent from the story. The Scroll of Esther is the only book of the Tanakh (The Hebrew Bible) that doesn't have God's name mentioned even once.

This idea of a hidden God is called *Hester Panim*, which literally means God's "hidden face." The name Esther, is spelled the same as the Hebrew word "*a-sa-ter*" which means "I will hide" – which is what God does throughout the story of Purim.

When teaching this, educators and rabbis often stress the focus on God's hiddenness and how this is similar to our relationship with God

today. Just as God doesn't speak to us today in concrete words like He did with the prophets. So too, the events in the Purim Story seem to magically unfold with God behind the scenes. God in the Purim Story is the puppeteer behind the curtain.

Rather than using the holiday of Purim as an opportunity to seek out God's hidden miracles, I think, instead, it should be used as a catalyst to see ourselves as God's hidden miracle-makers.

The Talmud teaches us that when the Torah teaches us to "Walk after the Lord, Your God," this means we are to do God's actions. Perhaps one of the ways to walk in the ways of a hidden (or hiding) God is to help the world in a humble, hidden fashion.

We live in a world of constant self-promotion and in the age of personal branding. What if God were the Jewish people's brand? What if doing things for the world that God wants done in the world was our primary mission? What if it were more important that God received the credit rather than us?

If we accepted these ideas of acting like the hidden God, our focus would be much more on doing for others than on being seen doing for others, and I would suspect, more of God's work would be done in the world.

Our Financial Situation



This month, I have good news. We refinanced the mortgage on our building two months early. We obtained a lower interest rate and a twenty year amortization (with a five year term), which means slightly lower monthly payments beginning this month. Thank you to Jeff Katz, President of the Beth Shalom Foundation, for negotiating the agreement with Commerce Bank, Brian Brockman for researching interest rates, Hanan Hammer for continuous monitoring of our budget, and Alicia Klein, Treasurer, for her assistance.

Thank you also to Ernie and Susan Rosenthal for Co-chairing our 5775 High Holy Day Appeal, which raised 125% of our goal. We exceeded our goal by \$20,000. This leads me

to the biggest thank you of all, to you and to us, to our congregants who have so generously supported our kehillah, our sacred community.

I mentioned our budget and Hanan's watchful management. We approved a balanced budget for this year, which has become our board policy. Like any budget we had negative and positive variances. Best of all because of our collective congregational generosity, we reduced our mortgage debt and at the same time achieved a much stronger financial position.

With the help of our Executive Director, Elaine Levine, the Beth Shalom Foundation, as part of its diligence and fiscal responsibility, has entered into an exhaustive analysis of the many generous funds which congregants have established over the

years. We are now using more of those funds to cover expenses for which the funds have been designated to enrich the experience of our kehillah. This also helps us get closer to our balanced budget.

Due to your support, our 135 year old congregation continues to grow in current relevance to our members and to our community. Thank you to everyone.

Community Passover Seder

This year's Community Second Night of Passover Seder will be held at CBS, Saturday, April 4 under the supervision of Rabbi David Glickman and the Vaad Hakashrut. Rabbi Scott White and Hazzan Tahl Ben-Yehudah will lead the seder along with Rabbi Glickman.

Because the second seder will begin after Shabbat, this event will follow a different format from recent years. It will begin at 7:30 pm with a Seduah Shlishit and will include family-oriented pre-seder activities and appetizers.

A communal Kiddush and Havdalah will begin at 8:30 and be followed by an abbreviated song- and discussion-filled traditional seder with ritual foods and a traditional dinner. Families are welcome, but child-specific

activities will not be offered during the communal Kiddush, Havdalah and Seder.

Cost for the entire evening is \$34.00 for adults and \$14.00 for children ages 4-9. Pre-seder and seder activities without dinner are \$18.00 for adults and \$11.00 for children 4-9. There is no charge for either event for younger children. Prices will rise, on a space-available basis, after the March 27 reservation deadline.

The Community Seder is sponsored by the Rabbinical Association, Jewish Family Services and the Community Legacy Fund of the Jewish Community Foundation, and is supported by participating Congregations. Passover Chocolate Chip Cookies



Ingredients:

- 1 cup sugar
- 1 cup oil
- 3 large eggs
- 1 cup cake meal
- 1 cup potato starch
- Juice of one orange
- 12 oz. package of Kosher for Passover chocolate chips

Directions:

- Beat together the sugar, oil, and eggs.
- Mix the cake meal and potato starch together and add to the mixture.
- Add the juice of the orange and the chocolate chips.
- Refrigerate dough for approximately two hours to harden.
- Lay parchment paper on cookie sheet and drop dough on paper. Bake at 325° for 15-20 minutes or until slightly brown.

manager and buyer of my childhood congregation's gift shop for many years".

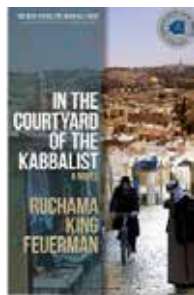

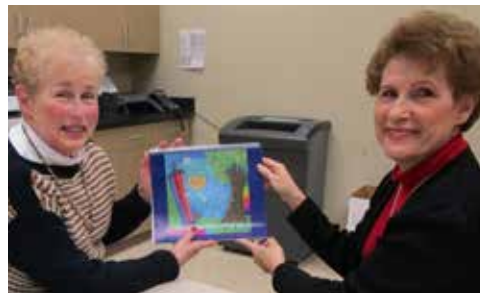

CBS Policy Changes

Security Updates

Because of heightened security, the following will remain in effect until further notice: a security officer is required for events of 75 persons or more for all CBS functions. It is the responsibility of the sponsoring group to pay for security. The minimum charge for security will be \$105 for three hours. If security is needed for a longer time, the charge will be an additional \$35 per hour.

Updates to the CBS Facility Handbook

All meat events at CBS require the presence of a mashgiach and are the responsibility of the hosting party. The cost for the mashgiach is \$100 per event.

Both changes are now in effect.

Purim Vs. Pesach



When I am asked what the most important thing about Purim is, I often answer in jest that it is the one-month reminder that Pesach is nearly here. There truly is a one-month spiritual timer that Purim sets in motion, with Pesach as the alarm.

Purim is the holiday of joy and celebration of the survival of our people who lived in ancient Persia at a time when we lived under the rule of a benign king and a maleficent advisor. The hero and heroine of the Purim story step up to the plate without God's intervention, and in fact, God does not seem to be involved whatsoever.

Compare this to the story of the exodus from Egypt; Pesach is a holiday of joy and celebration of the survival of our people who lived in ancient Egypt under an evil ruler whose predecessor had had Joseph as advisor. The hero of the Pesach story, Moses, steps up to the plate only after God tags him "it," so to speak. God is so involved in the Exodus that we must realize our "hero," Moses, is simply

God's messenger. There are striking similarities as well as polar opposites between the two stories, and structurally they are absolutely related.

We will be discussing this and more in Hebrew School throughout the months of February, March and April, looking towards Purim with fondness and looking forward at Pesach with all its attendant anxiety – how will I ever get the kitchen ready in time? Who is going to eat all the leftover Mishloach Manot? Is 5 pounds of matzah enough or too much?!? Spring holidays fly fast and furious, and at Beth Shalom, we'll be preparing for them – I hope you'll come learn and celebrate with us!
