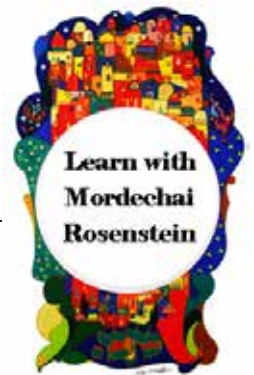

# From the Rabbi's Study

## Talking the Walk, Walking the Talk

The terms “Talking the talk,” and “Walking the walk,” often refer to speaking about what’s important versus doing what is important in life. It is easy to fall into a trap when looking at others and say about them that they “talk the talk” but don’t “walk the walk.” In other words that other person may speak or preach Jewish values or ethics, but doesn’t actually live them out in practice.

As we leave the holidays behind, it is important that the most valuable lessons of justice, righteousness and spiritual devotion not be left behind with our high holiday prayerbooks only to be picked up again next year.

## Peltzman Adult Education Classes Resume

Sisterhood’s Sarah Peltzman Adult Education classes will take place on Thursdays, from 10-11:15 am. Registration and classes will begin on Thursday, October, 10th. The cost for the entire year is \$10 for Sisterhood members and \$15 for non-members. Classes are open to all men and women in the community. We are privileged to have Mordechai Rosenstein as our guest lecturer for our first class.

The material for the class is from the “Walking With Mitzvot” and “Walking With History” sections. This is part of an adult education series published by the Ziegler School of Rabbinic Studies at the American Jewish University. Books have been printed and will be available for \$8.50 on October 10th.

The dates for the classes are: October 10, 17, 24, 31; November 7, 14, 21; December 5, 12; January 9, 16, 23, 30; February 6, 13, 20, 27; March 6, 27; April 3, 10; and May 1.

However, there is something that is even more challenging – and that is “Talking the walk,” and “Walking the talk.” I believe that the best way to have a relationship between talk and action is to comingle the two. It is not enough to act justly in the world. We need to explain to our loved ones, our coworkers, and our neighbors that we are giving to tzedakah and fighting injustice. We are celebrating unusual holidays or customs. We are supporting Israel because of our commitment to Jewish values and the Torah. After leaving synagogue, we must create action plans for how we are going to put into place the words from our prayerbook.

There will be a luncheon held on May 8, 2014, for all class participants.

## Celebrating 100 Years of the United Synagogue of Conservative Judaism

In 1913, Solomon Schechter, then President of the Jewish Theological Seminary, assembled a group of 22 synagogues to work together to develop their common mission “the development and perpetuation of Conservative Judaism.” Today, 100 years later, United Synagogue of Conservative Judaism consists of nearly 700 synagogues around the world including Congregation Beth Shalom. Beginning on October 11, the USCJ will celebrate its Centennial in Baltimore with a Shabbaton and subsequent meeting entitled “Conversation of the Century.” The “Conversation” promises to focus on “the challenges

and opportunities we face in re-imagining our kehillot – our sacred communities – for a changing Jewish world.” Many of the brightest minds and innovative leaders of the Conservative movement will make presentations at the convention.

Beth Shalom is fortunate that our congregant, Mirra Klausner, will attend the “Conversation” as the 2013 recipient of the Arthur Brand Leadership Award. The award, established in 1999 by Arthur’s family, recognizes new and emerging Beth Shalom leaders. Arthur was not only a leader at Beth Shalom (President and Parnas) but in many other Jewish

organizations. Mirra will officially receive the award from Betty Brand, in honor of her late husband Arthur, z”l, at Shabbat morning services on December 7th. The award includes a trip to the USCJ Biennial Convention. Mazal tov to Mirra and we look forward to hearing from you about the “Conversation of the Century.”

## PreK Class is Awesome!

Here we are in October and the fall holidays have already happened. Unbelievable! RFECEC has the most amazing new PreK program. Some highlights are:

- The children are given three sight words a week to learn, and the words are added to the sight word “bubble gum machine” as the kids master them. It is starting to fill up.
- On Mondays the students make their own lunches. This helps the children develop their fine motor skills as well as self-help skills. They eat healthier by trying new foods and love preparing the food!
- We are using *Everyday Mathematics* for our Math Curriculum. It was developed by the University of Chicago School of Mathematics Project. Children develop a broad

background by learning concepts and skills in all six strands: number and numeration, operations and computation, data and chance, geometry and patterns, functions, and algebra. *Everyday Mathematics* is a problem-solving approach based on everyday situations and playful activities. There is also a home component to the program so parents become a part of the learning process.

- *Handwriting Without Tears* is our writing program.
  - *Get Set for School* is our Literacy curriculum
  - *The Lake Shore Science Program* is our science program.
- We are very excited about our new curriculums and the great challenge we are presenting to our amazing PreK kids!

from the Rabbinical Association

Our Mishnah states that to "save one life it is as if you have saved the entire world." (Sanhedrin 4:5) Jewish law/Halacha holds that Pikuach Nefesh-saving human life- is of the utmost importance, and overrides almost every other prohibition and commandment in Judaism. One important way to carry out Pikuach Nefesh is through organ donation.



Holding to this sacred Jewish ideal, we, the Rabbis of the Rabbinical Association of Greater Kansas City, urge all within our Jewish community, in accordance with their Jewish practice and values, to consider registering for organ donor cards, and to be properly registered as organ donors in the manner prescribed by their state of residence. (We also understand that the appropriate time of and circumstance for organ donation may differ for each specific situation. Those making decisions regarding organ donation for themselves or on behalf of a loved one are encouraged to consult their own rabbi.) We also urge our Jewish community to educate themselves on the value of organ donation, the many lives saved by organ donation, and how Halacha allots to organ donation.

## Cheesecake Recipe by Judith Wasserman

**Crust:**  
1½ cups Graham cracker crumbs  
¼ cup powdered sugar  
¼ cup butter, melted  
Mix the ingredients together, and place in a spring form pan in the oven at 350°. Bake for 5-10 minutes.



**Filling:**  
2 8 oz packages of cream cheese  
2 eggs  
¾ cup of sugar  
½ tsp of vanilla  
Beat the cream cheese until it is very smooth and add the other ingredients. Pour the mixture over the crust. Bake at 350° for 25 minutes and set to cool in pan.

**Topping (preheat oven at 450°):**  
16 oz carton of sour cream  
4 Tbsp sugar  
½ tsp vanilla  
Mix the ingredients together. Place mixture on top of the cheesecake and bake in oven for 7-10 minutes at 450°. After cooling, remove the cheesecake and place in refrigerator. Remove ½ hour before eating. This cheesecake should sit at least two days before using.

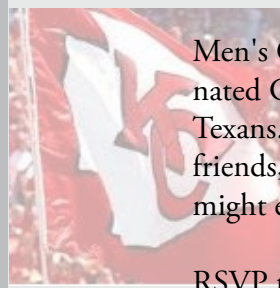
