From the Rabbi's Study

“Be Happy!” – An Instruction or a Description?



In the Torah, we learn about all of the major festivals that we celebrate throughout the year. Re-

garding the festival of Sukkot – which falls right after Yom Kippur – the Torah teaches us: “On the first day you shall take the product of hadar trees, branches of palm trees, boughs of leafy trees, and willows of the brook, and you shall rejoice before the Lord your God seven days.” (Leviticus 23:40).

This is the instruction of the mitzvah for shaking the lulav and etrog. The lulav and etrog are a bundle of branches from various types of trees, that we hold together with a special species of citrus (the etrog) to wave during services. (And you thought services were boring!)

The first part of the verse is an obvious instruction: it teaches us how to make a lulav and shake it with the etrog. The second, however, is a bit more confusing. It tells us to “Rejoice before the Lord your God...” In the Hebrew it says, “u’smachtem” -- literally “you shall all be happy.”

How can God command us to be happy? I believe that this is actually not an instruction, but a description. We are told what will happen to

us if we shake a lulav – we will smile and be happy. I have never seen somebody frown while holding a lulav!

Regardless of whether or not you consider yourself a regular “shul goer,” whether or not your family builds a sukkah or whether or not you’ve shaken a lulav since Sunday school – please come to weekday morning services during the week of Sukkot (October 1 – October 7) to shake a lulav. Rarely can religion promise happiness – but for these seven days it does.

Transitions of Fall

Fall is the time for transitions and new experiences. Whether you are preparing your child for preschool, kindergarten, middle school, high school or the big leap to college, transitions are scary as well as exciting! Some suggestions to help your child transition into a new situation are:

- Spend quality special time with your child in advance of a big transition.
- Help your children acknowledge their feelings and reassure them that you too feel anxious but you know the experience will be wonderful!
- If your children are starting preschool or kindergarten make sure you are reading to them every day.
- Encourage children to eat well and get enough sleep. Experts recommend 11-13 hours a day for a 3-5 year old. School age children need 10-11 hours a day.
- Buy a baby photo book and fill it with family pictures (including the family pet) and let your young children put it in their back pack. It is a great conversation starter for teachers and with other kids!
- Put a family picture in a plastic frame and let older children have it in their back packs if they are feeling anxious.
- Let younger children bring a security item to preschool to help them transition from home to school. The familiar smell and feel of an item is the little help most kids need to feel comfortable in their new environment.

I hope the year is filled with wonderful experiences, much learning, laughter and joy.

Barbecue Chicken Recipe (Family Recipe)

Ingredients:

Chicken (breasts, thighs or legs)
1/2 cup brown sugar
1/4 cup cider vinegar
3/4 cup catsup
1/4 Worcestershire sauce
2 tsp yellow mustard
3/4 cup soy sauce
1 tsp garlic salt
1 medium onion chopped.

Directions:

Blend all ingredients in a blender until smooth. Cook mixture on stove on medium and bring to a boil. Reduce heat and simmer 10 minutes. Season the chicken with season salt, garlic, and olive oil or other seasonings you like. Grill chicken on low (to avoid burning) on gas grill 15 minutes on each side, turning it once. Brush sauce on each side and grill approximately 10 minutes on each side or until cooked. You may have to turn chicken more than once to avoid burning. Times are approximate according to the heat of the grill. It's delicious! Refrigerate the extra sauce for another time.
