From the Rabbi's Study

Don't say "I will learn when I have time"; you may not have time!



The Jewish community is known for its commitment to educate its young. In Kansas City we raise millions of dollars annually to send children to Israel, day school, day camp, sleep-away camp, religious school, and youth group

programs. All of these events are important – but they are a fraction of people's lives. When people are active until 90, we are missing out on seventy-two years if we only focus on their Jewish learning until age 18.

Rambam, the great Sephardic rabbi and scholar, taught nearly a thousand years ago: "If a person wants to study Torah and he has a child whom he

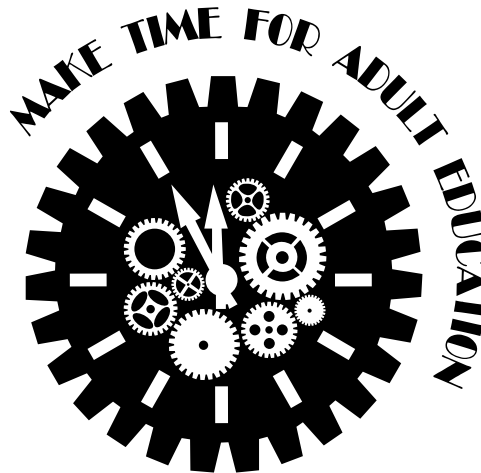
should teach Torah, his own Torah study takes priority over his child's... For just as he is commanded to teach his son, he is commanded to teach himself."

We can't teach another until we are learning. Thankfully, there are wonderful ways to engage in Jewish learning as an adult here in KC, and through CBS!

Security & Ticket Policy for the JCC

Each year, we must be diligent with our security procedures to ensure a safe environment for our congregants. To that end:

- All members in good standing will receive tickets by mail. Your children under age 25 are free and do not require a ticket when attending services with you.
- If you do not carry anything on the holidays, please know there will be a list at each door with the names of all members who have been mailed a ticket.
- Guest tickets are available on-line at \$150 each and will be mailed to either you or your guest, whichever you indicate.



- If your account is not current, please contact our bookkeeper, Pam Fite at 913-647-7271 to arrange a payment plan. If this is not feasible, please contact Bernie Fried at 913-647-7293. It is our mission for all congregants to be able to attend services irrespective of their financial situation as long as you contact Bernie before the holidays.
- Reciprocal Guest Tickets are available for those belonging to another Conservative Synagogue. Their home synagogue must order the tickets for

them. Guest ticket requests should be sent to Martha Hoffman at mhoffman@bethshalomkc.org.

- For non-members of Congregation Beth Shalom, we have free Rimon tickets to attend this service and free young family service tickets. Family services begin at 9:00 and tickets must be picked up at the front desk of the Pre-School prior to the holidays.

Apple Honey Bundt Cake

Ingredients:

- 1 cup white sugar
- 1 cup vegetable oil
- 2 eggs
- 3/4 cup honey
- 1 teaspoon vanilla extract
- 2 1/2 cups all-purpose flour
- 1 teaspoon baking powder
- 1 teaspoon baking soda
- 1 teaspoon salt
- 1 teaspoon ground cinnamon
- 1/4 teaspoon ground allspice
- 3 apples - peeled, cored and shredded
- 3/4 cup chopped walnuts

Directions:

1. Preheat the oven to 325 degrees. Grease and flour a 9 inch Bundt pan.
2. In a large bowl, stir together the sugar and oil. Beat in the eggs until light, then stir in the honey and vanilla. Combine the flour, baking powder, baking soda, salt, cinnamon and allspice; stir into the batter just until moistened. Fold in the apples and nuts.
3. Bake for 50 to 65 minutes in the preheated oven, or until a toothpick inserted into the crown comes out clean. Let cool for 10 to 15 minutes before inverting onto a plate and tapping out of the pan.

The batter of this moist and delicious cake could also be baked in two loaf pans. Reduce baking time to 45 minutes. To make this even more special, dust with confectioners' sugar, sprinkle with cinnamon, or drizzle with warm honey before serving.
