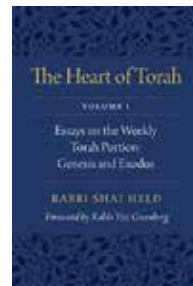
Building a Jewish Library: Reading the Weekly Parasha

During the summer, I wrote a piece in The Scroll that received a lot of positive feedback about books I recommended for spiritual preparation for the High Holidays. Many of you wrote lovely emails thanking me for the suggestions and appreciating being able to go into the new year more spiritually prepared. I am going to try to do a couple of these throughout the year under the rubric of “Building a Jewish Library.” By the way – these don’t have to be paperbacks or hardcovers. Many of these are available for e-readers or audiobooks. Reading the weekly Torah portion (parashat ha-shavua) is a wonderful discipline to keep your mind within the narrative framework of the Torah reading cycle. Below are some great and accessible resources. If you visit The Scroll online at <https://www.bethshalomkc.org/newsletter/> on our new website, the titles can be found on Amazon.

Reading Parashat HaShavua. The first step is just reading the Torah portion. I recommend MyJewishLearning.com which has a great summary as well as resources. If you want just the text, go to sefaria.org. If you want a hardcopy of the Chumash – which is the book that has the weekly Torah and Haftarah portions – reach out to me. We have some older copies of older translations and we’d be happy to give you one if we have extras.

The Bedside Torah, by Rabbi Brad Artson. This is a lovely, easy-to-read, commentary on the weekly Torah portion. Rabbi Artson is the dean of the Ziegler Rabbinical School at the American Jewish University. This is also available very inexpensively used from a number of sellers. The commentaries focus on contemporary issues and are designed for families to be able to read together.

Prof. Avivah Gottlieb Zornberg. My fondest memories of the last time I lived in Jerusalem was hearing Prof. Zornberg’s lectures on the weekly Torah portion. Yes, she is smarter than anyone you’ve ever met. Yes, she effortlessly weaves together psychology, philosophy, English literature, and literary criticism. Yes, you need to read her books with Wikipedia open and the Oxford English Dictionary. But her writing is gorgeous and her insights profound.



If you miss university literature courses and want the emotion you feel toward Shakespeare to transfer to the Torah – this is the author for you. All her books are available on Amazon. She has commentaries on Genesis, Exodus and Numbers by the weekly portions – as well as a few additional books.

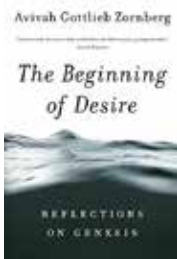
The Heart of Torah, by Rabbi Shai Held. You will often hear me quote Rabbi Held from the Hadar Institute. This is much headier and heavier than The Bedside Torah. Each essay is 4-5 pages in length, and there are 2-3 essays per Torah Portion. His essays are steeped in ancient rabbinic commentaries, medieval thought, and modern philosophy. You will see also, some of the beginnings of his theology of “The God of Love,” which was the basis for my Kol Nidrei teaching. [Note: The link on this is for a boxed gift set. If you purchase the volumes separately from the publisher, JPS, directly, it may be much less expensive]. Rabbi Held is a leading Jewish thought leader today.

Covenant & Conversation Series, by Rabbi Jonathan Sacks. Rabbi Sacks is an unbelievably prolific writer. The former Chief Rabbi of the United Kingdom, he dabbles in science, philosophy, leadership and rabbinic commentaries. He is an orthodox rabbi with an orthodox perspective on Judaism and a broad mindset in approaching the world. There is a volume for each book of the Torah, so to purchase the entire set is five volumes. Again, used copies available online.

Life Lesson 26: *“Your smile is your logo, your personality is your business card, how you leave others feeling after an experience with you becomes your trademark.”*

– Jay Danzie

There are seven billion, seven hundred million people living in this world of ours, three hundred and thirty million of them right here in the USA. We are all part of the family of man. We are all human beings, but we are not all the same. Like snowflakes falling from the sky, every one of us is unique.

The opening quote by writer and motivational speaker Jay Danzie tells us that we are judged by who we are as individuals, not by any group we may be associated with. Many months ago, I wrote an article about being yourself. After all, you can't truly be someone you're not.

I am Bernie Fried. I am a Jew. I am a unique individual. I love people. I believe in me and my abilities. I smile at everyone. I try to treat everyone with the same level of respect I would expect from them. I am not a clone but one of those 330,000,000 people living in this great country of ours. I strive to leave a positive impression on everyone, but I know I cannot please everyone.

Many years ago, a Japanese client flew into JFK airport in New York from Tokyo with his son who had never been to the United States before. His father called me before making the trip because his son had a bad experience with an American in Japan and had preconceived notions about Americans because of that experience. He did not like the American stereotype. He thought he knew what being an American meant, how Americans think, and believed Americans all felt superior to all other people in the world.

After welcoming his son to New York, I said, “You're in New York now Kioshi. Whether you like it or hate it, please don't judge the rest of the country by it. Every city is different. Every region has its own personality. Every person has his or her own individual traits.

Kioshi, please don't make the mistake of stereotyping any one of us. Please don't judge all Americans by the actions of any one individual. Your father and I have been friends for years,

but that doesn't mean all Americans are or ever will be friends with your father. It doesn't mean all Americans are friends with me or even like me. It does mean that two individuals became friends because we found more similarities in each other than differences. Our heritage never entered into it.

I don't ask for you to like me, only that you do not judge me because of the actions of others. Treat everyone fairly, but not necessarily the same. Give everyone an equal chance to prove themselves. Only when you take the time to know someone can you make a value based judgement.

Sheryl Sandberg, Chief Operating Officer of Facebook said, “We can each define ambition and progress for ourselves. The goal is to work toward a world where expectations are not set by the stereotypes that hold us back, but by our personal passion, talents and interests.”

Feel good about yourself. Set yourself off from the crowd but still be part of the crowd. Being an individual does not mean being a loner. It means we all have our own personality traits for people to see and for us to be proud of.

Like Mr. Danzie said, “Your smile is your logo, your personality is your business card, how you leave others feeling after an experience with you becomes your trademark.” Let's not give anyone a reason to stereotype us. Let's show the world what unique shape our snowflake is, what kind of unique individual we really are.

In considering what music to use in services, one thought is how can I make an emotional statement through song? On Yom Kippur, I used music to engage you in a special way in the avodah service, when we retell what the high priest used to do on Yom Kippur when the Temple was standing. At the end of this service, he would ask God to bless all of Israel with a year of abundance, good fortune, success, dew and rain and sun, consolation, and more. He would end the prayer that God should protect the inhabitants of Sharon, with the words, "May their homes not become their graves." The area of Sharon includes present-day southern Tel Aviv, Netanya and Herzliya, a low-lying flood plain. In the days of the Temple, this area would sometimes flood, destroying homes and killing their inhabitants, but when not flooded, it was a highly desirable place to live.

This prayer reminded me of the Naomi Shemer song Al Kol Eleh, where she prays to God to bless us, to protect us and our land; the honey as well as the sting, our infant children and our men coming home from war, the houses in which we live and the hills on which our children play. She prays that God should guard us in our stillness and our weeping as well as our

joy. I brought in this song's melody because I felt it invoked the feeling of the prayer of the high priest perfectly.

Over the honey and the sting, over the bitter and the sweet, and over our baby girl, please guard them all, good God. Over the burning fire, the crystal clear water and over the man who is coming home from afar – over all these things, please stand guard for me, good God – don't uproot the garden, don't forget the hope (a reference to Israel, the Hatikvah). May you return to me, and may I return to the good land (return = a theme of Yom Kippur). Save the houses that we live in... from sudden war-like thunder (a reference to the Sharon) – may you save them all.

If you are not familiar with this song already, I encourage you to look it up – find it on YouTube and give it a listen. It is a moving poem set to a simple and soaring melody, and it fits the emotional tenor of the prayer of the high priest perfectly.

Next month I will continue to investigate the relationship between music and our prayers. If you want to go deeper on this topic with me, let me know and we will do coffee! Have a quiet Cheshvan!

The Caretaker

I volunteer at AARP's income tax assistance program. We provide free tax preparation for low-income retirees throughout the city. One of those locations, the Ivanhoe Neighborhood Community Center, is two minutes from our former synagogue building on 34th & Paseo, and where the following experience took place.

Last April, I was preparing taxes with a buddy, Bill Rainen. While chatting with the client, a gentleman in his late 70's, Bill commented that, unlike most of our clients, the gentleman had built a large nest egg for retirement.

Noticing that the client lived close to 34th & Paseo, Bill remarked that his family lived near the "old" Synagogue when he was a toddler. Surprised, the gentleman said Beth Shalom was his first job, where he worked for a guy named Ray.

That's when I chimed in.... "I bet your boss was Ray Rainey!"

"Yes", commented the client. And then, he told this amazing story:

On my first payday at Beth Shalom, the caretaker, a little old

man, handed over my paycheck, and, said "come with me"... so we walked to the bank on 34th and Troost ...where he helped me open a savings account, and said, "you should deposit a small amount every time you get paid."

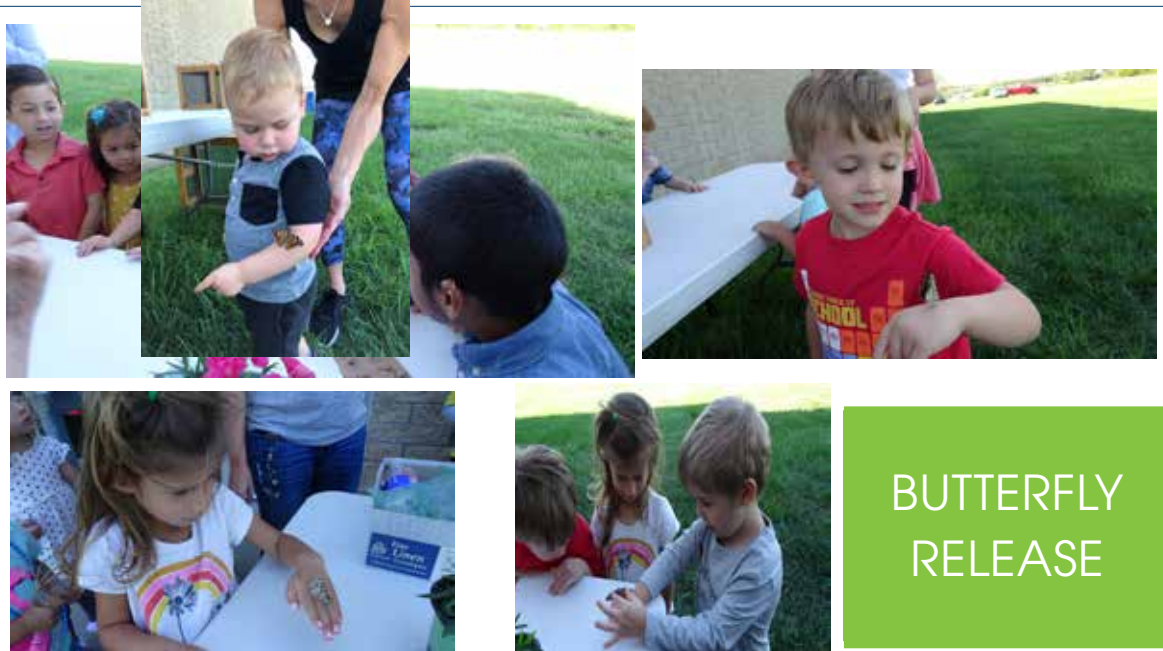
The little old man was Mr. Sam Kopel. Sam with his wife, Sarah, was the resident caretaker and "mashgiah" of our congregational kitchens for over 25 years, retiring in 1976. The kindness of this lovely couple, survivors of the Holocaust, played an important role in the simchas of the membership, the training of our congregational youth, ...and likely the lives of many others with whom he came into contact.

The lesson taught by Mr. Kopel became a value in the younger man's life, and a lesson that changed the outcome of his later years. I was able (indirectly) to witness that at least one life was changed because of Mr. Kopel's sage advice.

Note: Ray Rainey was manager of Beth Shalom's building and custodial needs for over 40 years, at both Paseo and Wornall locations where his friendly face greeted preschoolers, Hebrew school kids, their parents, and all who entered the building.

Garden Project

This summer my wife Cathy Newman (who teaches at the Beth Shalom Preschool) asked me to help her take care of the preschool garden and I was happy to help.

There were 3 box gardens on the south side of the building growing vegetables. As the summer went on weeds in the gardens grew out of control therefore killing the vegetables. I decided something needed to be done to correct this problem. I put some thought into how we could rebuild the gardens and came up with the idea of getting help from Beth Shalom's Scout Troop 61.

I worked on my idea with Cathy and once we had something in place, I presented my idea to Judy Jacks Berman and Beth Shalom's Troop 61. The Beth Shalom preschool was using a company called Kansas City Community Gardens to help them over the years with the gardens, so we decided to contract with them for soil and supplies we needed to rebuild the gardens.

As we finalized the plans Kansas City Community Gardens donated three more boxes so the Preschool could have

six garden boxes in all. On Sunday, October 6, with the help of Troop 61 adults and scouts, we built the Beth Shalom preschool six new garden boxes.

While the boys got to work, a couple of Troop 61 adults cooked hot dogs for the troop and helpers. The Boy Scouts began with placing the wooden boxes on the ground where we thought appropriate.

Next, the boys put hemp coffee bags on the ground which will help keep weeds from growing in the garden. Lastly the troop took turns filling and leveling out the boxes with fresh garden soil.

It was a very successful and fun day for the troop to help the Beth Shalom preschool with their new garden. The plan moving forward is for the Preschool children to plant a vegetable and butterfly garden in the spring. I would like to thank those who helped and Troop 61 for making this service project a success.
