## You Don't Need to be Israeli for this Election

In 1897 in Basel, Switzerland, Theodore Herzl famously opened the Zionist Congress as the supreme body for the Zionist Organization. This was the first formal act that put the wheels into motion to form the State of Israel. Herzl famously wrote in September of that year: "At Basel I founded the Jewish State. If I said this out loud today, I would be greeted by universal laughter. In five years perhaps, and certainly in fifty years, everyone will perceive it."

Herzl's vision was prescient. Exactly fifty years later, the United Nations voted on the Partition Plan in 1947. The Zionist Congress became the World Zionist Congress, the Zionist Organization became the World Zionist Organization, and even after the establishment of the State of Israel in 1948, the WZO still exists.

Every five years, there is a World Zionist Congress elected, and this non-governmental organization helps decide the priorities and focus of the worldwide Zionist movement.

The World Zionist Congress is the only democratically elected body serving all of world Jewry. It is the governing body for the World Zionist Organization, the Jewish National Fund (JNF) and the Jewish Agency for Israel (JAFI).

We, as American Jews, have the opportunity to elect close to 30% of the delegates to the WZC, and America has many Zionist political parties. The party for the Conservative Movement is Mercaz USA.

I want to encourage you to register to vote for Mercaz. A vote for Mercaz supports the three principles of their Zionist platform: Religious Freedom, Democratic Principles, and Celebrating Diversity. Involvement in the WZC is one way to advocate for greater flourishing of Conservative (or Masorti as it is known in Israel) Judaism.

In college, I had a friend who had been born on February 29. Officially, she only got to celebrate the day every four years. So when she turned 20, we threw her a 5th birthday party.

I mention this not just because February—and this year, February 29—are upon us again, but because I have long been fascinated by the rhythms of the calendar and, more generally, how we measure time. And despite the quirks of our lunar scheduling—who needs a leap day when you can have the occasional leap month?—perhaps no people quantifies and qualifies time quite like the Jewish people.

We believe in sacred space, but also sacred time. As Rabbi Joseph Soloveitchik wrote, “In Judaism, time is something substantive. There is something called ‘yom kadosh,’ holy time. Days and hours are endowed or saturated with holiness. The day is not just a number [on a calendar]. It is a creation in and of itself.”

As the afterglow of Hanukkah has faded and the Purim pre-partying has not quite ramped up, February (or Shevat) may seem an uneventful stretch of the Jewish year. But, of course, at Congregation Beth Shalom, there is opportunity for Jewish community every Shabbat, including the next Tefillateinu instrumental service on February 8—and beyond.

Take just one quick look at the synagogue calendar (really, go to [bethshalomkc.org](http://bethshalomkc.org) and click on the Calendar link and View Recent Experiences link...I'll wait) and you'll see the month is full, from daily minyan, to weekly adult learning, to our annual Breaking Bread fundraiser and the next Shabbat Around the World (this time, we're "visiting" India). The next installment of #PopUpRabbi with Rabbi Glickman is just one example of how this time needn't be tied to any particular space.

**Look, between work and family and so many other commitments, we don't need a reminder that time is a precious, dwindling commodity. But that's the point—what gives this “Jewish time” its specialness is the opportunity it provides (and that we might not otherwise plan) for creating community.**

So here's wishing you all an event-full February and a meaningful Shevat. And to anyone who happens to have been born on the 29th, a special happy birthday!

### Warm Up America

Beth Shalom Sisterhood's WARM UP AMERICA Project (WUA) recently donated 20 unique, beautiful and warm afghans to a residential organization that helps young women who have completed treatment for drug and/or alcohol abuse. Amethyst Place located in downtown Kansas City, not only provides an apartment for each person, but also guidance in how to lead a better and "cleaner" life. The photo shows one of Amethyst Place's staff receiving some of the lovely 20 afghans created by our WUA participants.



Through the last 10 years, WUA has donated about 340 afghans to numerous organizations which then distribute them to individual people. We knit or crochet 7" by 9" rectangles which are then artistically designed and sewn together. We are more than willing to teach or reteach anyone who wants to be a part of this special group of women!

We meet at Beth Shalom the first Wednesday of the month from 10:00 am to 12:00 pm. Some people come just to turn in completed rectangles and/or pick up new yarn, while others come to stay and chat a bit. The yarn is paid for by our Sisterhood. Every Shabbat morning, as part of the Torah service, we recite the Prayer for Our Country. I am pretty sure I memorized the prayer for our country when I was 18 or 19, as we recited it every Shabbat morning at the shul I attended as a college student in Ithaca, NY. I remember during the Clinton administration how I snickered at the phrase “affairs of state.”

There have been times when I have felt particularly strongly about different phrases of this prayer – but never before have I felt the words of this prayer should be internalized more than now. In the first paragraph we recite, “...that peace and security, happiness and prosperity, justice and freedom may forever abide in our midst...” In this prayer, it may seem that we assign to our government, leaders and authority figures the job of seeing to these benefits.

In the next paragraph, however, we continue to ask God to bless every person with the spirit of God so that we will, ALL OF US, work together to “...banish hatred and bigotry and safeguard the ideals and free institutions that are the pride and glory of our country. ”

Sometimes it seems to me that we drone through this prayer. I fear it is not because we find it boring. I’m afraid we recite these words without connecting to them because if we connected to these words, we would understand that they urge us to action.

**This prayer is a call to all of us to step up to the plate and do our part – this prayer is NOT simply a plea to God to endow our leaders with wisdom and Torah learning. This prayer is a call to each and every one of us to get up and DO SOMETHING. This prayer demands that each of us must treat everyone with compassion.**

The last paragraph begins, “May this land... be an influence for good throughout the world...” I have to tell you, *land* influences no one to be good. *People* influence others to be good. Each of us must recognize that WE are America, and WE must be an influence for good throughout the world. The change we are praying for begins with each of us, every single moment.

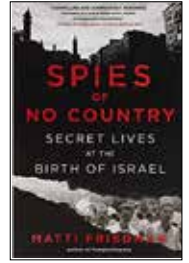
